A performance by the Kids on the Block is more than a demonstration of inclusion, more than an instructional session on various disabilities, and more than an entertaining performance. It is the unforgettable opportunity to get to know Abbie, Anna, Brenda, David, Mark, Michael, Ellen Jane, Eddy, Melody, Joanne, Mandy, Jennifer, Renaldo, Brian, and Nam as just regular kids on the block.

Performances can be organized for groups up to fifty and for adults as well as children. The set design, length of the show, and number of performing puppeteers are adjusted according to accommodations and audience size.

A Kids on the Block performance combines knowledge of special education and experience with disability in a creative and dramatic medium: puppetry. Kids on the Block performances are based on an ancient Japanese form of puppetry called Bunraku, in which the audience is allowed to see the puppeteers, who are dressed completely in black.

Specific questions about disabilities are answered by the puppets and puppeteers. This exchange with the audience reinforces the unique and often humorous communication of facts and feelings that is the essence of each performance.
