

PROGRAMS FOR INFANTS & CHILDREN:

- The Elizabeth Lee Black School, an approved private school for students ages 3 through 21 with autism, intellectual disabilities and multiple challenges.
- Bright Beginning early intervention therapies for infants and toddlers.
- Happy Hearts Preschool, featuring "inclusive" classrooms for typically-developing children and students with disabilities.
- The region's only inclusive preschool program for children who are deaf and hard of hearing.
- Pre-K Counts classes with full-day preschool for "at-risk" children.

BARBER BEHAVIORAL HEALTH INSTITUTE:

A wide range of therapies, psychological and behavioral services and supports for any child or adolescent with mental health challenges:

- Barber Behavioral Health Institute Outpatient Clinic offering counseling and medication management for children, adults, couples and families.
- Behavioral Health Rehabilitation Services (BHRS) and mobile therapy in the home and in school.
- Family counseling, grief and trauma therapy for children and social skill development.
- Partial hospitalization programs for children to meet acute needs and prevent out-of-home placement.





EMPLOYMENT & VOCATIONAL SERVICES:

Opportunities for adults to develop skills needed to live as independently as possible:

- Community Participation Supports with activities that promote recreational and daily living skills.
- Supported Employment Program with placement in jobs in the community.
- Small Group Employment to build job skills.
- Retirement Center with recreational therapeutic activities for an aging population.
- Pre-Employment Transition Services to help students prepare for employment while still in school.

LIVING IN THE COMMUNITY:

- Residential homes in neighborhood settings.
- Lifesharing, linking families to share their homes with an individual for a long-term relationship.
- Expanding Socialization Opportunities (ESO) dances for young adults in collaboration with area colleges.
- Agency with Choice to support individuals as they reside with their families.
